Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3394P-11 Panel – Multi), cut:

- Fussy cut (1) 17 ½" x 32 ½" panel.
- Place fusible web on the remaining fabric and fussy cut (4) 4 ½" squares centered on an animal.

Fabric B (1351-Red Just Color! – Red), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 21 ½" WOF strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut (4) ears of corn.

Fabric C (1351-Sunshine Just Color! – Sunshine), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.
- See instructions to cut (2) ears of corn.

Fabric D (3395-1 Farm Scene – White), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 20 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric E (3398-16 Words – Multi), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 35 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric F (3399-11 Tossed Animals – Blue), cut:

- (5) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 49 ½" strips and (2) 4 ½" x 42 ½" strips.

Fabric G (3396-11 Veggies – Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- See instructions to cut (4) ears of corn.

Fabric H (3399-44 Tossed Animals – Yellow), cut:

- See instructions to cut (2) ears of corn.

Fabric I (1351-Orange Just Color! – Orange), cut:

- See instructions to cut (2) ears of corn.

Fabric J (1351-Lime Just Color! – Lime), cut:

- (2) 1" x 33 ½" WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (14) husks.

Fabric K (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.

Backing (3399-14 Tossed Animals – Multi), cut:

- (2) 50" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 50" x 65" for the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise indicated.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the $17\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $21\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x $35\frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
2. Refer to Figure 2 to arrange and press the (4) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A squares onto the (4) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C squares.
3. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (4) A blocks (Fig. 2).

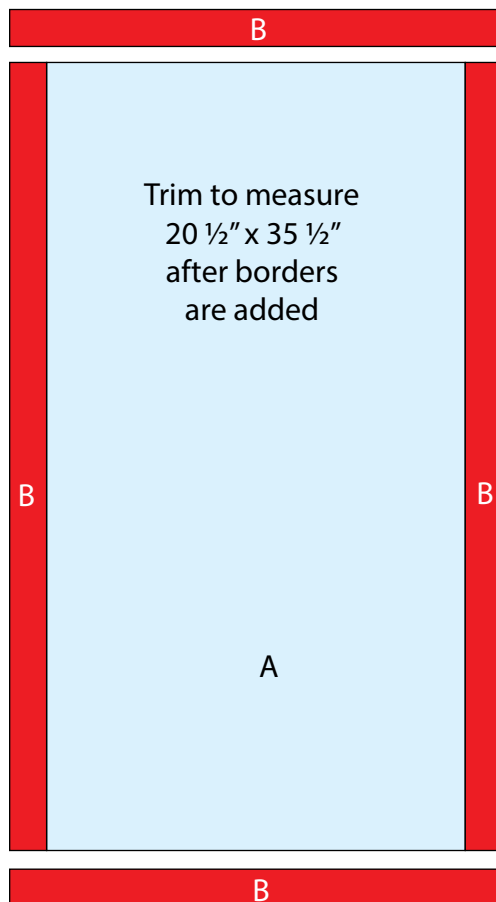

Fuse A onto the center of C square

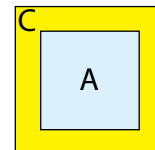

4. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $\frac{1}{8}$ " outside the drawn lines.
5. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.

6. Press the assorted ears of corn, husks and stalks onto the (2) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 35\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E strips to make (2) E strips (Fig. 3). Finish the raw edges of the appliquéd shapes with a decorative stitch such as buttonhole or satin stitch to finish the E strips.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

7. Sew (1) E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) A block to each end of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 20\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

8. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 47\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric K strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 34\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

9. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 49\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric F strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric G square to each end of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 42\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric F strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

10. Press the quilt top and $50'' \times 65''$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

11. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

12. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.

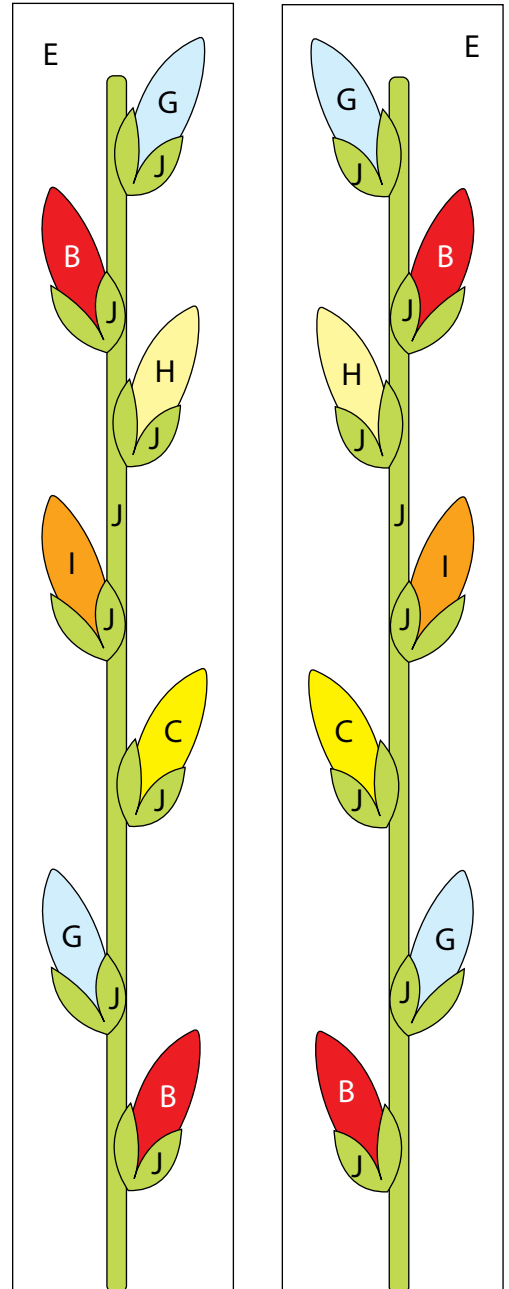
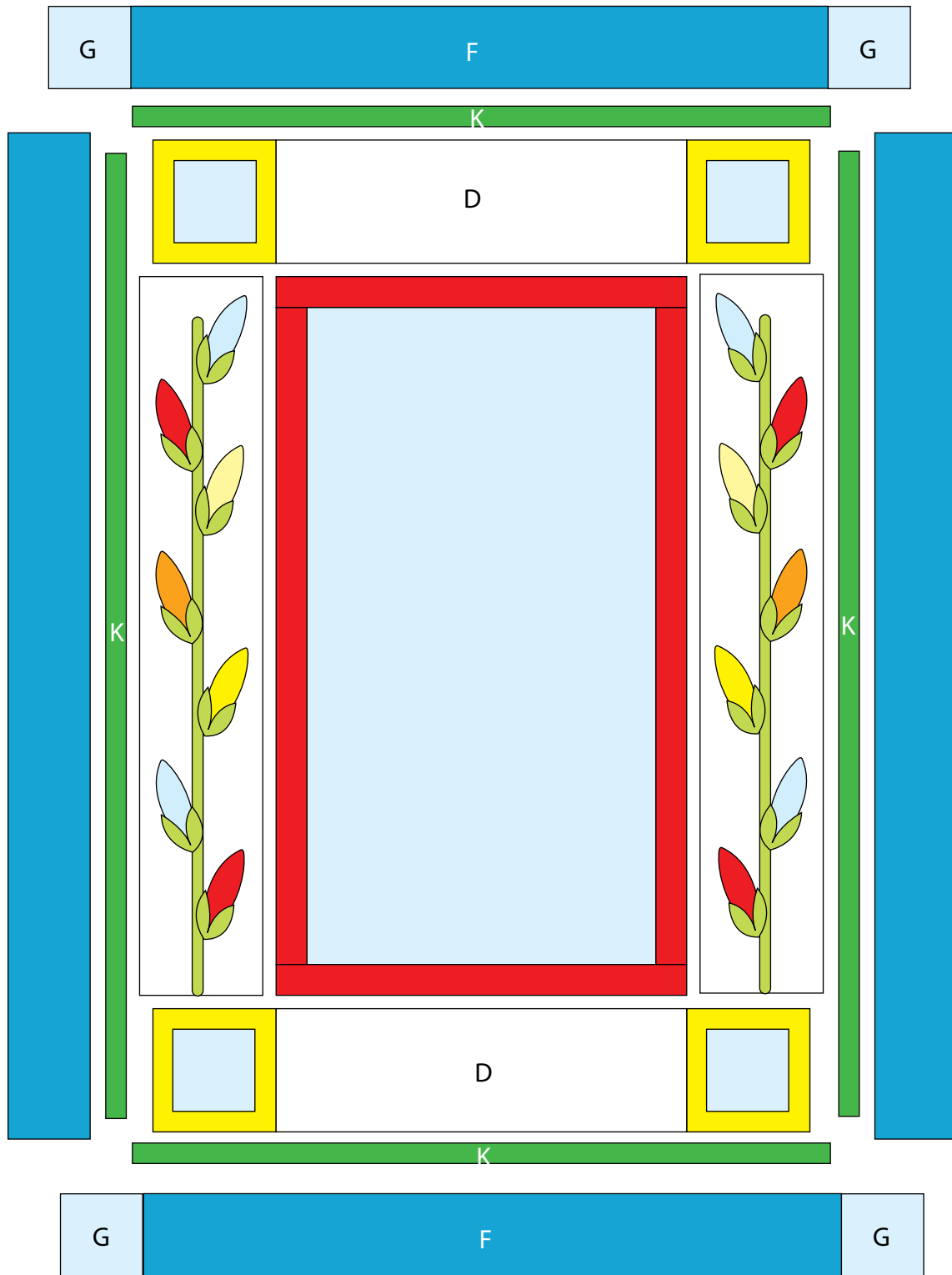
